



*ROBINS CITY COUNCIL
Minutes of the January 6th, 2020 Meeting*

Mayor Hinz called the meeting to order on January 6th, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in the Robins City Hall. Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, roll call was taken with Councilors Roger Overbeck, Marilyn Cook, Dick Pilcher, Brad Sevcik and Don Norton present along with Engineer Dax Suntken, Attorney Ryan Tang, Planning and Zoning Administrator Dean Helander, Building Official/Public Works Superintendent Vince Bading, Police Captain Gary Manhart, Fire Chief Brian Boots, and City Clerk/Treasurer Lori Pickart. There were no guests in attendance. Norton moved to approve the Agenda, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- > Mayor Hinz noted we are quickly approaching the budget season.
- > Brad Sevcik, Streets Coordinator noted everything is quiet in the streets department.
- > Don Norton, Parks and Recreation Coordinator provided a "Thank You" from Gary and Sandy Schwab of the 620 Foundation for the city's donation for compensation of their Mr. and Mrs. Claus appearance at the Tree Lighting and Kids Christmas Party. He noted the Civic Club meeting is scheduled for the evening of January 14th, at 7:00 p.m. adding the club continues to search for help in planning the upcoming events such as the Easter Egg Hunt and the Robins Roundup Festival.
- > Marilyn Cook, Finance Coordinator noted both the Road Use receipts and LOST receipts are coming in over budget.
- > Dick Pilcher, Public Safety Coordinator thanked Chief Boots for the written Fire Department report. Police Captain Gary Manhart thanked the Council for their support in the past year adding there were approximately 500 calls for service in 2019. He noted the new SUV has been built but not yet shipped.
- > Roger Overbeck, Public Works Coordinator noted most everything has been addressed in the Engineers Report. Bading noted the detention basin in the Turnberry sub-division has been filled. He added it looks like a mess, but dirt piles were added to settle over the winter and will be completed in the spring.
- > Engineer Dax Suntken reported work continues on the S. Troy Park Restroom/Pavilion facility. He noted they will be completing the installation of the doors and roof this week and begin on the inside work, ie fixtures, plumbing, painting and finish the outdoor painting once the temperatures rise.

Mayor Hinz noted the Robins Economic Development Initiative (REDI) report was supplied to the City Council of which the Council had no comments or questions.

There were no citizen comments. Pilcher moved to approve the Consent Agenda which contained the Minutes of the December 2nd meeting; the Financial Report; the List of Bills Submitted; Resolution No. 0120-3 approving Pay Request #6 to Peak Construction in the amount of \$71,183.15 for work done on the S. Troy Restroom/Pavilion Facility; and Resolution No. 0120-1 restricting vehicle weight on city streets. Cook seconded, on the vote, all voted aye.

Mayor Hinz noted he and City Staff have reviewed the 1999 Snow Removal Policy and amended it to meet today's standards. Sevcik moved to approve Resolution No. 0120-2 adopting the revised policy, Overbeck seconded and all voted aye.

The Council agreed to use the mid-month meeting on January 20th at 5:30 p.m. as the budget meeting and set January 22nd at 5:30 p.m. as an alternate date should there be a need for it.

Sevcik moved to adjourn at 7:32 p.m., Pilcher seconded and all voted aye.
