MINUTES OF THE SEPTEMBER 21<sup>ST</sup>, 2020 MEETING

Mayor Hinz called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. in Robins City Hall on Monday, September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020. After the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, roll call was taken with Councilors Roger Overbeck, Don Norton, Dick Pilcher and Marilyn Cook present along with Planning and Zoning Administrator Dean Helander, Captain Gary Manhart, Attorney Ryan Tang, City Clerk/Treasurer Lori Pickart and two guests present. Absent was Councilor Brad Sevcik.

Norton moved to approve the Agenda, Cook asked to add "Discussion of the Upcoming Bond Sale" to the agenda. Overbeck Seconded the motion to approve the agenda as amended, and all voted aye.

CITIZEN COMMENTS – Non-Agenda Items

- Ricky Franks, 670 S. Troy Road asked the Council when the wood chip pile at the South Troy Park would be removed. Mayor Hinz commented that hopefully all of the debris will be picked up by September 30<sup>th</sup>, then the contractor will begin hauling the chips to another location.
- Ken Veerhusen, 690 S. Troy Road noted the smell from the chips is becoming over-bearing. Mayor Hinz confirmed the contractor and staff are working as fast as they can with the clean-up and removal of the Derecho debris.

BUSINESS ITEMS

- a. Street Finance Report. Pickart explained the Street Finance Report to the City Council as far as receipts from the State and expenses incurred during FY 20. Norton moved to approve Resolution No. 0920-8 approving the Street Finance Report, Pilcher seconded and all voted aye.
- b. Purchasing Policy. The Council reviewed the Purchasing Policy and agreed it did not need to be amended, but needs to be more closely adhered to.
- c. Bond Sale Info. Cook noted an upcoming public hearing will be held at the October 5<sup>th</sup> meeting, noting since we are using some of the money for the Kings Way Water Loop to help fire flow pressures at Tradesman Square, Otter Creek Country Stores and Eagle Ridge Commercial subdivision, a part of the bond sale can be paid by with the use of Tax Increment Financing. She noted the bond will increase by approximately \$367,000.

Pilcher moved to adjourn at 5:54 p.m., Cook seconded and all voted aye.
