



ROBINS CITY COUNCIL
MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 4, 2017 MEETING

Mayor Hinz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Robins City Hall on Monday December 4, 2017. After the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, roll call was taken with Councilors Marilyn Cook, Dick Pilcher, Roger Overbeck, Don Norton and Brad Sevcik present along with Attorney Ryan Tang, Engineer Dax Suntken, Officer Gary Manhart, Fire Chief Brian Boots, Building Official Vince Bading, City Clerk/Treasurer Lori Pickart and 12 guests. Norton moved to approve the agenda, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Mayor Hinz noted there are several things going on around town.
- Finance Coordinator Marilyn Cook noted the Main Street project is the most expensive project the city has ever done.
- Safety Coordinator Dick Pilcher noted he has learned that the city does allow open burning in some parts of town. He thanked the city staff for their time and helpfulness during the Main Street Reconstruction.
- Public Works Coordinator Roger Overbeck reported receipt of the invoice for the last round of this year's leaf pickup. He noted the contractor charged an extra \$200 to pick up a mixture of grass and leaves during the first round and recommends the city pay this as he went above and beyond. The Council agreed they did a fine job this year.
- Parks Coordinator Don Norton thanked Chief Boots and the Robins Fire Department for making the Christmas Tree Lighting a success. He also noted the Civic Club meeting is scheduled for Monday December 11th, 7:00 p.m. here at City Hall.
- Streets Coordinator Brad Sevcik echoed thanks to the City Staff relating to the street project. He noted he has received great comments relating to this year's leaf pickup.
- Engineer Dax Suntken noted most of the Main Street project is wrapped up. He noted they continue to work on the light poles, signage, and top soil.

There were no Citizen Comments.

CONSENT AGENDA

Sevcik moved to approve the Consent Agenda with the inclusion of the additional bills and the additional \$200 to Jordan's Property Management for the leaf pickup, Pilcher seconded on the vote, all voted aye. Items approved were the minutes of the November 14th and 20th meetings; the Financial Report; the List of Bills Submitted and added to; and Resolution No. 1217-3 approving Pay Request #7 to BWC Companies in the amount of \$174,145.72 for work done on the East Main Street Reconstruction Troy to Mentzer.

NEW BUSINESS

- a. **RBI TEAMS.** Casey Mulherin, Mike Marek, Doug Lane, Robert Morris and Terry Delay introduced themselves noting they are the coaches for two additional Robins Baseball Instructional Academy teams to represent the City of Robins along with several members of the teams. Pilcher commended all of the coaches involved and moved to approve Resolution No. 1217-1, acknowledging the teams, Norton seconded and all voted aye.
- b. **No Truck Routes.** Mayor Hinz noted with the cost of East Main Street nearing \$2M, he would like to keep trucks over 10 ton off of Main Street. He proposed Resolution No. 1217-2, which would keep heavy trucks off of Main Street, North Troy Road, Quass Road, East Robins Road, and Robins Road. He noted these trucks could continue to make deliveries to their locations in

Robins, but could not use those streets for traveling through town. Cook noted she feels it is not fair to the quarry. The Council agreed to table action on this item until the businesses in town could be contacted.

NEW BUSINESS

- a. **Parking on Private Property.** Pilcher moved to approve the second reading of proposed Ordinance No. 1707 relating to parking on private property, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye. Sevcik moved to suspend the rules and pass the Ordinance on its Final Reading by title only, Pilcher seconded. On the vote all voted aye.

Sevcik moved to adjourn at 7:49 p.m.
