



ROBINS CITY COUNCIL
MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 4TH, 2021 MEETING

Mayor Hinz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Robins City Hall on Monday, October 4th, 2021. After the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, roll call was taken with Councilors Marilyn Cook, Dick Pilcher, Roger Overbeck, Brad Sevcik and Don Norton present along with Police Captain Gary Manhart, Building Official/Public Works Superintendent Mike Kortenkamp, Attorney Ryan Tang, and City Clerk/Treasurer Lori Pickart along with two guests. Norton moved to approve the Agenda, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- ~ Mayor Hinz reported he was notified by Wendling Quarries stating they will be hauling gravel to the Tower Terrace Interchange through the end of this week from 9:30 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. and will be going north on Mentzer Road to County Home Road. He also reminded the Council to review the 5-year Capital Improvement Plan and be prepared to discuss necessities at the upcoming 5-year CIP meeting in October or November.*
- ~ Parks Coordinator Don Norton noted the parks have been very busy and will be closing the end of October. He noted the Civic Club will be meeting on Tuesday, October 12th 7:00 p.m. at City Hall. He reminded the audience of the upcoming Civic Club sponsored Trunk or Treat at the South Troy Park on October 24th, from 3-4:30 p.m. He noted they are working on the kid's Christmas Party coming up in December.*
- ~ Streets Coordinator Brad Sevcik noted the department has been busy working on streets where sub-standard paving is creating voids beneath the street. He added other street information is provided in the Engineer's Report.*
- ~ Public Works Coordinator Roger Overbeck noted with the drought, the detention basins have been running smoothly. He deferred to Mike Kortenkamp, Public Works Superintendent who reported the sewer point repairs on Maple Street will be happening in the very near future.*
- ~ Safety Coordinator Dick Pilcher noted the city was actively involved with an operation quick find today which had a good ending. He noted the fire department has been quiet for the past month.*
- ~ Finance Coordinator Marilyn Cook noted the city is three months into the FY 22 and needs to amend the budget. She noted the upcoming West Main Street reconstruction will be a very expensive project for the city.*

Mayor Hinz introduced Max Goodin to the City Council. Mr. Goodin noted he is a member of Troop #42 and is working towards his Boy Scout Eagle rank. He added in order to become an Eagle Scout; he must organize and raise funds for a service project. He asked permission to install a bicycle maintenance station on city property along East Main Street within the city parking lot. He advised the Council of the type of station and budget for the project, hoping the station will be completed by Mid-May of 2022. The Council was very enthused to have this great addition to the city! Norton moved to approve the project, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye.

CITIZEN COMMENTS – Non-Agenda items

- Bruce Lyon, 435 Beverly Street noted there are five persons who have yet to connect to the municipal water system in the D&M Addition. He noted the well is no longer being checked and nothing is being reported to the DNR. He added the system is failing; insulation is falling off the pressure tank and is pretty sure there has been no chlorination to the well. He noted the remaining residents*

are at high risk for contamination. Pickart noted she would work with the remaining residents to get them connected.

CONSENT AGENDA

Pilcher moved to approve the Consent Agenda which contained the Minutes of the September 2nd and 13th meetings, the Financial Report; the List of Bills Submitted and the additional bills submitted. Cook seconded the motion and all voted aye.

OLD BUSINESS

- a. Ordinance No. 2109. Overbeck moved to approve the Third and Final Reading of Ordinance 2109 amending Chapter 151 of the Municipal Code relating to trees/shrubs. There was no discussion, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye.*

NEW BUSINESS

- a. Resolution No. 1021-1; FY2021 Street Finance Report. The Council reviewed the FY 21 Street Finance Report. Sevcik moved to approve Resolution No. 1021-1 approving the report, Pilcher seconded and all voted aye.*
- b. Resolution No. 1021-2. Cook moved to approve Resolution No. 1021-2, setting the date and time of November 1st, 2021, @ 7:00 p.m. to hold a public hearing relating to amending the FY 22 Budget, Overbeck seconded and all voted aye.*

Sevcik moved to adjourn at 7:34 p.m.
