



ROBINS CITY COUNCIL
Minutes of the April 19th, 2021 Meeting

Mayor Hinz called the meeting to order on Monday, April 19th, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. Roll call was taken with Councilors Marilyn Cook, Roger Overbeck, Don Norton and Brad Sevcik present along with Attorney Ryan Tang, Planning and Zoning Administrator Dean Helander, Building Official/Public Works Superintendent Mike Kortenkamp, and City Clerk/Treasurer Lori Pickart. There were no guests. Absent was Councilor Dick Pilcher.

Mayor Hinz introduced Mike Kortenkamp, the new Building Official/Public Works Superintendent to the Council who warmly welcomed him. Norton moved to approve the Agenda, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye.

CONSENT AGENDA

Cook moved to approve the Consent Agenda, Overbeck seconded. Items approved were the Minutes of the April 5th, 2021 meeting; Resolution No. 0421-3 approving the Cigarette Permit Application for Casey's Marketing Company; and Resolution No. 0421-6 approving the Cigarette Permit Application for Otter Creek County Stores. All voted aye.

NEW BUSINESS

- a. Mayor Hinz opened a public hearing to hear comments and concerns relating to the annexation request of Adan & Gloria Cervantes at 5:34 p.m. There were no comments received for or against the annexation request. The public hearing closed at 5:36 p.m.
- b. Norton moved to approve Resolution No. 0421-7 approving aforementioned the annexation request, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye.
- c. The Council reviewed the proposed 10-ton embargo on East Knoll Drive due to the closure of County Home Road. East Knoll Drive is an asphalt road and not constructed to accommodate the additional heavy trucks in the area. Iowa Code 321.1 shows the penalties to enforce the embargo. Cook noted the city should look at making this a permanent closure to heavy trucks. Sevcik moved to approve Resolution No. 0421-9, Norton seconded and all voted aye.
- d. The Council reviewed two proposals received from two contractors relating to security cameras at both city parks. Several questions were raised by the Council. Cook moved to table Resolution No. 0421-10 until more questions could be answered, Norton seconded and all voted aye.
- e. Pickart noted the city has two zero-turn mowers to mow parks, city detention basins, etc. She added a new mower is in the budget for FY 22 and asked if we could move that up a couple of months as the oldest mower is in need of replacement sooner rather than later. Cook moved to approve Resolution No. 0421-8 allowing the purchase of the replacement mower immediately, Overbeck seconded and all voted aye.

Sevcik moved to adjourn at 6:24 p.m., Overbeck seconded and all voted aye.
